# Brampton is the fastest growing city in Ontario. Growing at 3 times the Provincial average, supported by multiple regional infrastructures.




# In 2018, City Council endorsed the '**Brampton 2040 Vision**', a forward thinking blue-print for a new growth model based on TOCs.


