Regional Economic Benefits of Climate Adaptation

- A regional cost-benefit analysis that **examines the economic risk** that sea level rise poses to the region and the potential benefits of adaptation
- Joint project between ULI, the Southeast Florida Climate Change Compact, and AECOM, with partners:
 - Florida DEP, the Beacon Council, Greater Fort Lauderdale Chamber of Commerce, Greater Miami Chamber of Commerce, Broward Workshop, and the Community Foundation of Broward


Findings


- The study found that there is a **compelling business case** for the Southeast Florida region to make significant investments in flood-resilient infrastructure now, and to continue to work together as a region to advance resilience over the long term
 - The benefits of investing in building-level adaptation outweigh the costs 4:1
 - The benefits of investing in community-wide investments outweigh the costs 2:1
- To safeguard investments and support a thriving future economy, now is the time for the industry to invest in resilient infrastructure
- Coordination between the public and private sectors is imperative
